# 1981 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

It does not seem presumptuous to say that God, providentially, is moving us now toward unity. We see in our time an increased consciousness of the Holy Spirit among Christians. The ecumenical movement itself is recognized by the churches as a movement of the Spirit.

May the week of January 18-25 be for all of us a time to reach out to Christ more earnestly. Let us pray in Him and through Him and with Him that we may at long last be one again, all reunited and made one in Christ Jesus.

Next weekend, January 24/25, a second collection will be taken after Communion for our diocesan Missions in El Salvador.

This past year in El Salvador has been a tragic one. The Saintly Archbishop Oscar Romero was murdered while celebrating Mass; two members of our own mission team, Sister Dorothy Kazel and Miss Jean Donovan, and two Maryknoll Sisters gave their lives in the service of the Church and the poor; and hundreds more are experiencing real personal suffering each day. Looking beyond all this is to see the presence and violence of evil--the evil of power and greed, the evil of anarchy that strikes out to destroy all that is not its own.

This tragedy has united the Church of Cleveland, and, in fact, the Church of the U.S. in a deep bond of prayer for the families of all the victims of such violence and for all the Salvadorean people.

We pray specially for those in our own State Department who formulate policy and direct aid to Latin American countries. May the Holy Spirit guide them to promote true peace and justice.

A good response lets us know that you are interested, that you know I value your imput, that I wish to respond to your needs wherever possible. But I have learned long ago not to be too discouraged by poor response—to meetings, to calls for volunteers, and to questionaires.

Of the 73 who responded, 40 favored air conditioning, 19 were opposed, and 14 were neutral.

On the question of Christmas Mass times: many wanted to keep the Midnight Mass and to have the Vigil Mass at either 7 or 8 p.m.

As far as suggested activities: teenage socials were in most demand, with many wanting some form of adult spiritual renewal, parents-family education explanatory sermons, parent-child dinners, etc.
Hopefully, a number of these will become a reality in the months to come.


