Because of the continuously increasing costs of every item necessary for the life of our parish, the fees charged in the P.S.R. program will be increased for the coming year. Many of you will remember Father as a man of great compassion and charity, whose life of quiet, generous service enriched the lives of so many throughout the world.

Father Maher's vision let him to purchase additional land during his pastorate here which enabled us to develope this Parish Center. He celebrated the last Mass in our Old Church and, when his health permitted, was always pleased to visit with us.

Father Edward F. Maher, the GOLDEN jubilarian and faithful priest, was called home August 27th. May he live in God's joy forever.
