A few weeks ago Father Tom O'Donnell, the former diocesan music director, conducted a workshop here for our Church musicians. Here are a few of the thoughts that came from this meeting:

The liturgies that we participate in each weekend are essentially a prayer, a public prayer which we as a believing community offer to our God. Song is a most worthy expression of that prayer and should be used to enhance and highlight the liturgy.

Central to our worship is the Gospel and the Consecration prayers. Thus, the Gospel acclamation (alleluia or praise to you...) and the memorial acclamation (Christ has died, ...) and the Great Amen should normally be sung. Beginning next weekend, our song leaders will help us to sing these prayers.

Some of the other prayers such as the Holy, Holy, the Our Father, the Lamb of God, add solemnity to the celebration when sung but are more of an optional nature, much depends on the mood of the congregation and the celebrant.

Appropriate hymns likewise enhance our prayers. We will seek to change them less frequently and to foster our growth with occasional new hymns.

Our singing has shown marked improvement these past few weeks. For this we do thanks you. We could still use some strong male voices—so men, sing out!
