At our June meeting the council approved plans to publish a new updated pictorial directory of our Parish for the tenth anniversary of the dedication of the new building. This is still some time off; however, some ground work needs be done now to have it readu for the fall of 1987.

More good reading on the front side of this bulletin. Food for thought! Some useful hints for parents to "help your children want to go to Mass," adapted from Jim Breig in the newsletter 'Bringing Religion Home.'

- 1. Kids' bodies follow where they want to go emotionally & spiritually. The trick is to get them to want to go. Start with them in the baby years explaining religion & religious practices to them at their level. The "cry room" is a place for the kids to pray & worship, it is a special place. It is preferred that little kids, even in the twos and threes, be in the main church area, up front, where they can see and participate.
- 2. Let your children help determine what Mass the family will attend. Let them go to a special Mass at another Church, occasionally, such as the Cathedral in Cleveland, or maybe a Byzantine Liturgy.
- 3. Don't complain, be negative, about Church—the sermon, collection, pastor, music, etc. Kids so often reflect adults' attitudes. If you see value in what is happening, more than likely your kids will too, even if they don't let you know it at the time.
 - 4. "I don't get anything out of the Mass." Can you draw money from the bank without putting anything first into it? Why are you here? What are you doing? How have you prepared for this Liturgy? Do you listen, sing, pray, with the congregation?
 - 5. Don't be afraid to show discipline or exercise your authority—this is what the family does every weekend, the only question is, possibly, what Mass DO we participate in. Good habits are formed by repetition.
