To be specific, Lawson Milk Company stores have become the largest retailer of sexually explicit materials in northeastern Ohio. In October they were presented over 32,000 signatures requesting that they remove such materials from their stores. They have not responded.

> Now, Bishop Pilla and I along with the full and strong approval of our Parish Council ask you not to shop at Lawson's until such materials are removed; and we encourage you to express your concern to the management of other places are available and to request their removal. RAMBLINGS FROM ROME: This week we received a <u>long</u> letter from Father Reymann. Here are some excerpts:

"I will begin with the highlight of the week and, very possibly, of the 3 months. That is this morning's Papal Mass at 10 a.m.. Our group of 37 priests was exceedingly fortunate to be allowed to participate in this celebration by distributing communion. The many Italian guards outside the Vatican checked our passes, gave us an electronic search, then directed us to the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. This magnificent chapel — probably as large as St. Pat's was covered with more art work than our Cathedrals have. After putting on vestments, we had close to an hour before leading the procession, so I spent time soaking up the art work, and prayed for all of you, my family, special friends and special needs. I was happy for this hour of recollection. As the Pope approached (during mass), he paused directly in front of me — I snapped his picture and then again a few moments later when his back was to me. RAMBLINGS FROM ROME: This week we received two letters from Father and on Wednesday a telephone call at 11:30 a.m. (5:30 p.m. Rome time). He sounded as if he were next door. The weather in Rome has turned rainy and damp and the North American College is built with much marble thus increasing the chill and dampness—He has a slight cold and said that he is now missing home and will be ready to return. His trip's desire was fulfilled yesterday morning when he and other priests CONCELEBRATED MASS WITH THE POPE—"Was so happy to return here to Rome and find a dozen letters waiting after a wonderful trip to Israel. Security was tight at the Ben Gurion airport — 6 hours of waiting for the plane. The Holy Land seems much as it was in Christ's time — an occupied land with

much thinly disguised tension. I found the Palestenian Arabs to be friendly, honest, good people who want to live in peace but are not even considered citizens in the land of their birth. The terrain is so rugged, mountainous, desert or semi-desert to the North as in Galilee and along the coast of the Jordon Valley. We saw herds of sheep and goats - what do they feed on? - and camels down by the Dead Sea. Good thing they go for long periods without water. I really appreciate all the letters sent to me - just sorry that I cannot answer them individually."



So much is beyond words - to be on the Mount of Olives and look over the Kidron Valley up to Jerusalem makes scripture come alive! Today we drove along the Dead Sea and got a good idea of the life of John the Baptist. We then drove north

from Jerusalem along mountain ridges and valleys, which were often trails used in Christ's day - stopped at Jacob's well - story of the Samaritan woman - then to areas frequently mentioned in Biblical accounts of Christs ministry. - Beatitudes.
