For Catholics: Catholics fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist  
when they receive Holy Communion in fulfillment of Christ's command to eat His  
Body and drink His Blood. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion,  
communicants should not be conscious of grave sin, have fasted for an hour, and  
seek to live in charity and love with their neighbors. Persons conscious of grave  
sin must first be reconciled with God and the Church through the sacrament of Pen-  
ance. A frequent reception of the sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all.

For Other Christians: We welcome to this celebration of the Eucharist those  
Christians who are not fully united with us. It is a consequence of the sad di-  
visions in Christianity that we cannot extend to them a general invitation to  
receive Communion. Catholics believe that the Eucharist is an action of the  
celebrating community signifying a oneness in faith, life and worship of the  
community. Reception of the Eucharist by Christians not fully united with us  
would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray.

For Those Not Receiving Communion: Those not receiving sacramental Communion are  
encouraged to express in their hearts a prayerful desire for unity with the Lord
