Seems awfully early for Lent to begin, and it is, but begin it does

with ASH WEDNESDAY this week. The article below lets us know what we should do as far as fasting & abstaining. That makes a good beginning. To get into the spirit of Lent, I would hope many of you will be at Mass this Wednesday, at the Stations on the other Wednesdays, and that you will set aside a few minutes each day for some lenten reading and reflection.

As an aide in this, we have ordered a pamphlet for each family entitled "Returning--God's Love Calls Us Home."

It is by Father Henri Nouwen, a very fine

contemporary spiritual writer. It contains meaningful, brief reflections for each lenten day. Take a booklet home with you Wednesday or next weekend.

Today we celebrate World Marriage Day with its theme--Marriage - a Journey of Love. A few months ago the Pope said: "Marriage is a unique type of relationship, and all the actions whereby spouses manifest their love for each other are part of God's plan and signs of his love." May we as individuals and we as a parish do all that we can to strengthen marriage and family life. We pray today for the team and couples participating in the Pre-Cana day.

What are the rules for Lent?

Dear Padre,

Could you clearly list the laws of fast and abstinence to be followed during Lent? I'm also interested in the significance of penance during this season.

Dear Francis,

Let us begin by defining our terms. To fast means to limit the quantity of food eaten. To abstain, in this context, means to refrain from eating meat. Catholics are obliged to abstain from the eating of meat on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays during the season of Lent. We are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday.

The obligation to abstain from meat binds Catholics 14 years of age and older. The obligation to fast, limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals in the course of a day, binds Catholics from the ages of 21 to 59. (The ages are 18 to 60 in Canada.) Those who are sick and women who are pregnant are not obliged to fast.

Forms of penance, and a penitential spirit, have been part of the Church from its earliest days. The early Christian community at Jerusalem gave up the ownership of their goods for the support of the community (Acts 2:44; 4:32). Saint Paul presented his self-imposed penance as an example for all Christians (1 Corinthians 9:27).

Friday has long been kept as a day of fast in memory of the Lord's suffering and death on that day. During this season of Lent we can easily find ourselves centering our total practice of penance around Church laws concerning food. The Church also encourages us to a deeper life of prayer. A real act of penance might involve ministering to the needs of others, especially the poor and most abandoned of your neighborhood.

Lent recalls the love of our Redeemer. May we actively do what we can to share that love through purposeful penitential practices.

## We Believe: The Creed We Believe in One God

As Christians and Catholics we do believe in God. Those not of our persuasion often wonder why; people seek a rational explanation for our faith. There is no perfectly logical answer; faith is not a math problem but a mysterious gift. We said that last week: Faith is more in heart and soul than head and mind.

Great thinkers through the ages have been able to present us with cogent reasons for faith in God. Let's look at three.

First, the universe in which we live must come either from a God (some would say "a force") who put it into being or from nothing. There are no other alternatives. Down through the ages most have thought it more reasonable to believe that the universe comes from someone rather than from nothing.

The second reason is built around the laws of chance. Chance is a random occurrence without organization or plan. For example, if I take 10 coins dated 1971 to 1980 and try to pull out 1971 by chance, the odds are 10 to 1. If I try to pull out 1971 and 1972 in order, the odds jump to 100 to 1. The odds against pulling out 1971 to 1980 in order are 10 billion to 1. Sounds like the lottery! What are the chances that the whole universe, with all its magnificent organization, could have been formed purely by accident? The odds against this are so great that chance alone makes credible the existence of a divine creator.

The third reason has to do with us. Nothing in this world brings complete happiness. Life doesn't make sense unless we are moving toward a God who will give us that for which we long. Saint Augustine said it well a long time ago: "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you."

The inquiring human intellect may not always be completely satisfied with the logic of faith, at least in part because God is more than the mind can ever comprehend. A reasonable case can be made nonetheless. Those who do believe understand clearly that God must be first in our lives, he must be the object of our daily prayer, he must be the guide for all our living.

In our search for a deeper faith in God, we should remember the prayer in Mark 9:24: "I do believe! Help my lack of trust!"

Catholics make up about 26 percent of the American population, roughly 53 million Catholics. One in three Catholics lives in the suburbs; 39 percent of Catholics still live in the central cities.

Gallup finds stability and growth to be the benchmarks of American Catholic religious life in the 1980s. Two-thirds of American Catholics show a "great deal" or a "lot" of confidence in the Church and 80 percent give high approval rates for local parish priests.

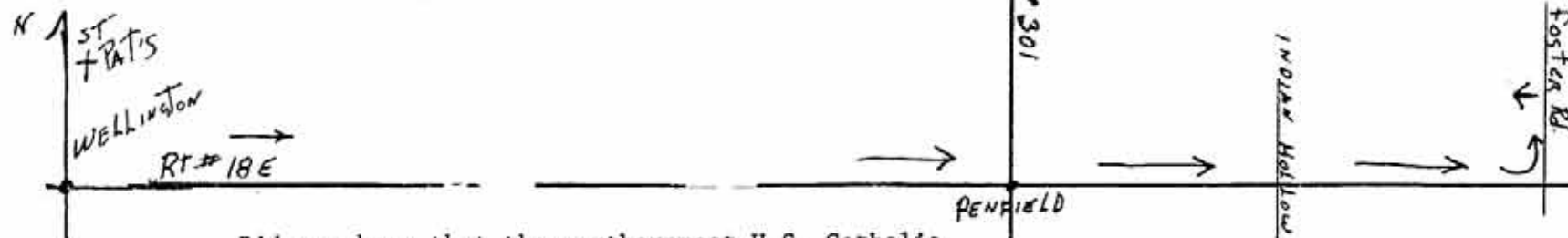

Over and over, you hear that you as parents and guardians, are the primary educators of your children. GROWING IN GOD'S WORLD (for 5 year-olds) is a delightful celebration of life in God's world, getting to know Jesus and learning to live as a member of God's family.

be bound in heaven" (Matthew 16:18-19).

Peter is a key player in the history of the Church.  
He is named first in the list of the apostles (Mark  
3:16-19); he is the central figure in gospel events such  
as walking on water (Matthew 14:28-32); he is singled  
out by the Lord to shepherd the flock (John 21:15-19).  
Peter is the first to proclaim the gospel publicly (Acts  
2:14-40) and becomes spokesman for the apostles.

Peter went to Rome, where he was martyred. His  
successors as bishop of Rome were recognized as  
leaders among the bishops just as Peter had been  
leader of the apostles. Historically the popes have  
been visible signs of Jesus' presence and action in the  
world; they have been signs of unity, calling all to be  
one flock under one Shepherd.

From the time of Jesus Christ, through the pontifi-  
cate of John Paul II, there have been 262 popes. Some  
have failed, which should not surprise us. Christ chose  
twelve, and one of those was Judas. Peter himself  
denied the Lord.

The Spirit, of course, would never allow the Church  
to be misled in essential matters of faith and morals.  
This is the basis for our doctrine of infallibility, a  
doctrine that applies only when certain conditions are  
met: The pope is speaking *ex cathedra*, that is, as  
leader of the whole Church; he is dealing with faith or  
morals; he is expressly defining the doctrine as a  
matter of faith. All of these conditions have been met  
only once in the past one hundred years, when Pius  
XII defined the Assumption in 1950. We must remem-  
ber, too, that the pope's noninfallible teachings are  
also significant ways in which Christ guides his Church  
through the Holy Spirit.

The papacy is not just an institution; it is Christ's  
gift to the Church. John Paul II is pope but also Holy  
Father; he is priest, teacher, leader, and sign of unity.

## We Believe: The Creed Sacraments: the sources of holiness

Last week we described the sacraments as our personal encounter with Christ. This week we look again at the sacraments, now examining their foundation in the Scriptures.

Before his Ascension, Jesus commanded his apostles to baptize all nations "in the name 'of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit'" (Matthew 28:19). In the waters of Baptism, Christ frees us from the power of sin and gives us eternal life.

Confirmation completes Baptism. At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came upon the apostles (Acts 2), making them bold and zealous missionaries. The Holy Spirit comes upon us through the anointing of Confirmation, offering us the courage and strength required to follow Christ and to proclaim his gospel.

At the Last Supper, Jesus took bread and wine and said, "This is my body...this is my blood" (Matthew 26:26-28; see John 6:54). We believe, as Paul teaches (1 Corinthians 10:16; 11:23-29), that in the Eucharist we share the Real Presence of Jesus and are united to his life, death, and Resurrection.

On Easter Sunday, Christ gave his apostles the power to forgive sins: "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive men's sins, they are forgiven them; if you hold them bound, they are held bound" (John 20:22-23).

Jesus' first miracle occurred at Cana (John 2:1-11). Saint Paul speaks of marriage as a mystery that refers to Christ and the Church (Ephesians 5:31). The love of husband and wife is so great that they are earthly witnesses to the depth of Christ's love for the Church.

At the Last Supper, Jesus told his apostles, "Do this as a remembrance of me" (Luke 22:19). This mandate, along with the call to baptize and forgive, forms the biblical foundation for the priesthood.

Christ healed the sick and comforted the dying (Luke 4:38-40; 23:43). The sick are to "ask for the presbyters of the church. They in turn are to pray over him, anointing him with oil in the Name [of the Lord]" (James 5:14). Through the Anointing of the Sick, Christ heals today and gives assurance to the dying, "This day you will be with me in paradise" (Luke 23:43).

The goal of this evaluation should be a situation which will promote quality liturgical celebrations in our parish.

Parishioners will be invited to participate and take an active role in this consultation and decision making process within our parish community. Your input will be of valuable importance to our ability to best evaluate our present weekend liturgies and to make plans for the future.

### **PARISH LITURGY EVALUATION**

The quality of our Sunday celebration of Eucharist affects our ability as a parish to reflect and grow as a community of faith, united with the Risen Lord. We have a need and a responsibility to make our experience of Sunday liturgy a full expression of our Christian faith through quality liturgical celebrations. This means we need to form ourselves as an involved community of prayer.

It is the very nature of our Sunday Eucharistic assembly and the requirements of the revised liturgy that impel us to evaluate the quality of our Sunday liturgies and also to determine how well our weekend Mass schedule supports our communal growth and prayer life together.

Bishop Pilla is asking us, in the next few weeks, to review the quality of our weekend liturgies and our schedule of weekend Masses to see if there are ways we can grow in our communal prayer as a parish faith community.

Parishioners will be contacted for their valuable input and reflections upon our present weekend schedule and the quality of our liturgies. This review will help us better plan and prepare for our parish community's liturgical future.

### Advent: Season of the Unexpected

Frank Semyck

Advent is layered with expectation. The season  
joyfully anticipates Christmas and all the good feelings  
associated with the celebration of the Lord's birth.  
People begin to focus on a new year, resolving to  
make changes: more prayer, less anger, weight reduc-  
tion. The Church's prayers and observances during  
these weeks encourage us to look confidently beyond  
the new year even to the Second Coming of Christ at  
the end of time. In all these respects Advent rivals  
spring as the season most characterized by our yearn-  
ings for new life and new hope in God.

The readings for this Fourth Sunday of Advent are  
a pointed reminder that God's blessings often come in  
unexpected ways. King Ahaz might have anticipated  
a sign from God in the form of a larger and better  
equipped army for the southern Kingdom. Ahaz never  
would have dreamed that the birth of a Child would be  
the sign announced by the prophet Isaiah. Similarly,  
whatever else Joseph and Mary might have expected  
from each other in marriage, neither one could have  
foreseen all the demands that God would make of  
them in adjusting to the birth of the Messiah.

We Christians share desires and hopes that are  
common to people everywhere. We seek good health,  
happiness, and peace of mind; work that is meaningful  
and rewarding; friendships that are wholesome and  
enjoyable; family relationships that are nourishing and  
supportive. We have every confidence that God will  
respond to our needs as a loving and concerned  
parent.

The lesson of this Fourth Sunday of Advent, how-  
ever, is that these hopes should not lead us into  
premature expectations about the specific manner in  
which the divine response will express itself. We  
would be mistaken to assume that we know best when  
and how God can most effectively intervene in our own  
lives or in the life of the Church. Placing personal  
expectations on God inevitably leads to placing un-  
realistic expectations on others and on ourselves. This  
all too readily leads to disappointment or disillusion-  
ment.
