A VOCATION VIEW: A good Vocation Prayer to say every day,
from the time we are ten years old till we are ninety years
old, is found in today's First Scripture Reading: "Speak,
Lord your servant is listening." Just try it with sincerity
starting today.

The Latin American Mission Collection is scheduled for January 26th-27th,
next weekend. This is the collection from which comes a large percentage
of the support for our mission in El Salvador. The following is an excerpt
from a letter received in our office and gives some insight into the
Missionary experience.

It's 9:30 P.M. on Thanksgiving Day in La Libertad, El Salvador. As
I write, one of your fellow priests of the Diocese of Cleveland lays there on
a canvas cot sleeping the sleep of exhaustion and contentment. He has had a
busy day. Morning saw him on the bus from the other end of the country. As
soon as he arrived, one of the Sisters called him to hurriedly baptize a baby.
The limbs of the child were already cold at the approach of death. After baptism
the parents just waited in the Church for the inevitable. Another Clevelander
arrived in a flurry of excitement. He had a new experience to relate. During
a guerilla attack he attempted to make himself one with the floor tiles for
about an hour while bullets were heard hitting the roof. He says he will
make sure the floor is cleaner for the future.

The Cleveland Team had Mass together and sat down to Thanksgiving
dinner. They were able to find a Turkey this year and even some Cranberry
Sauce. We had our fill and a lot of laughs. Then there was another sick call
out in the hills and the burial of the baby who had just died in the Church.

The lines must be down as there is no electricity again tonight so
I think I will turn in. But first I thank God for our Mission in El Salvador
and for our fine team here.

GUILD LADIES--next gathering will be for the Evening of Recollection on Monday, the 25th of February with Father Loya directing. All ladies encouraged to participate.

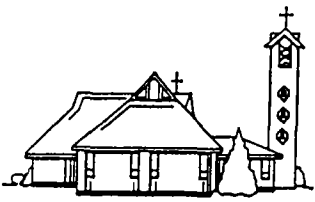
LEAD, KINDLY LIGHT

The selection below was written by Saint Thomas Aquinas, d. 1274, philosopher, theologian, Dominican priest and doctor of the Church, for this feast of Corpus Christi. He also authored the hymns "O Salutaris," "Tantum Ergo," and others still sung at Eucharistic Devotions. After seeing a vision of the Lord, he considered his monumental twenty books to be "as so much straw" compared to what was revealed.

O precious and wonderful banquet!

Since it was the will of God's only-begotten Son that men should share in his divinity, he assumed our nature in order that by becoming man he might make men gods. Moreover, when he took our flesh he dedicated the whole of its substance to our salvation. He offered his body to God the Father on the altar of the cross as a sacrifice for our reconciliation. He shed his blood for our ransom and purification, so that we might be redeemed from our wretched state of bondage and cleansed from all sin. But to ensure that the memory of so great a gift would abide with us for ever, he left his body as food and his blood as drink for the faithful to consume in the form of bread and wine.

O precious and wonderful banquet, that brings us salvation and contains all sweetness! Could anything be of more intrinsic value? Under the old law it was the flesh of calves and goats that was offered, but here Christ himself, the true God, is set before us as our food. What could be more wonderful than this? No other sacrament has greater healing power; through it sins are purged away, virtues are increased, and the soul is enriched with an abundance of every spiritual gift. It is offered in the Church for the living and the dead, so that what was instituted for the salvation of all may be for the benefit of all. Yet, in the end, no one can fully express the sweetness of this sacrament, in which spiritual delight is tasted at its very source, and in which we renew the memory of that surpassing love for us which Christ revealed in his passion.

It was to impress the vastness of this love more firmly upon the hearts of the faithful that our Lord instituted this sacrament at the Last Supper. As he was on the point of leaving the world to go to the Father, after celebrating the Passover with his disciples, he left it as a perpetual memorial of his passion. It was the fulfillment of ancient figures and the greatest of all his miracles, while for those who were to experience the sorrow of his departure, it was destined to be a unique and abiding consolation.

Like Saint Thomas we are invited this Wednesday to spend some time in EUCHARISTIC PRAYER in the Chapel. It is said of Thomas that he learned more about the Lord in prayer than he did through all his years of study. From after morning Mass until 5:15 p.m. Yes, the air conditioner will be on!




