

This Sunday, January 11th @ 2:30 pm, the PARENTS of our First Communion children will meet in the Chapel to go over the preparation for this grand event and to give out the textbooks used in preparation for First Reconciliation.

STROKE SCREENING on Thursday, January 22nd at the Town Hall Gymnasium.

Life Line Screening is a mobile health screening service that screens for Stroke, Peripheral Arterial Disease and Aortic Aneurysm. They will be using Ultrasound and Doppler equipment to view the arteries. The first test will view the carotid arteries looking for plaque build-up, where 75% of strokes originate. A second test checks the aortic vessel in the abdomen for a breakdown in the lining of the vessel. This is known as an Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm. A third test, an A.B.I., is also performed to screen the lower extremities for plaque buildup, known as Peripheral Arterial Disease. This disease is directly linked to coronary heart disease. Each test is painless and non-invasive and only takes about fifteen minutes. Results are read by a physician on staff and mailed within 7 days. The cost is \$35 for each screening or \$95 for all 3 tests and only takes a couple of minutes. Pre-registration is required which can be done by calling the Life Line Screening office at 800-897-9177.







...Today's readings challenge us to think about who our neighbor is. The lonely person next door? The elderly man across the street? Sometimes it is easier to reach out to these "neighbors" than it is to show compassion and unconditional love to the demanding child, the rebellious teenager, or the withdrawn spouse. Let's include those with whom we live as our "neighbors", practice the "Good Neighbor Policy" and watch the results!

Today's Gospel story of the good Samaritan is probably one of the most familiar parables in all of Sacred Scripture. This familiarity may hinder its many messages getting through to us. That's why I have today added the photo at the left, reduced from the posters in the entranceways first printed by the Glenmary Home Missionaries many years ago.

Before the parable account, Jesus has the lawyer answer his own question about how to inherit everlasting life. He gives the Old Testament twofold law of love which ends with "and (you shall love) your neighbor as yourself." After forty years of working with people, I feel this is the crux of the whole matter--too many of us do not really have a good, wholesome love of ourselves. Thus, we can not love our neighbor--the person in need of our gifts.

"God made me. God doesn't make junk." Each of us can say that even with all my faults, sins, handicaps, limitations, etc., etc., God still loves me. He does this because he is God. And we must reach out to the neighbor because we are made in God's image. (Check the other side for another slant on this parable.)






