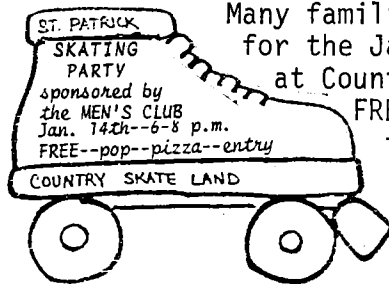

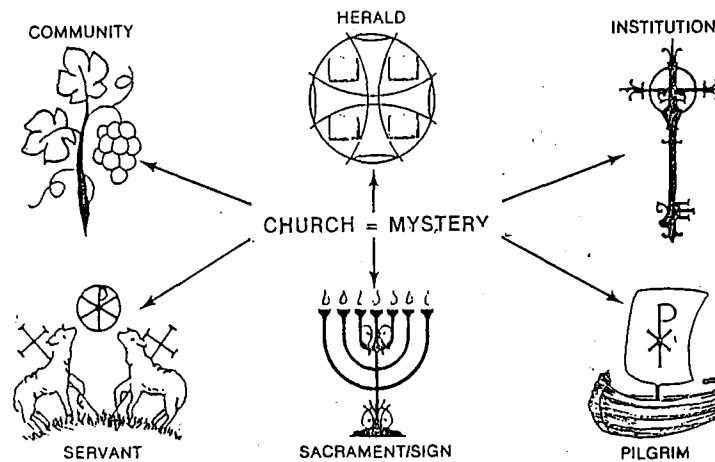

When you see these candles burning let it be a reminder to pray for those special intentions. And please, when you light a candle do not drop anything into the candle space, i.e. spent matches, bits of paper, such are a real fire hazard.

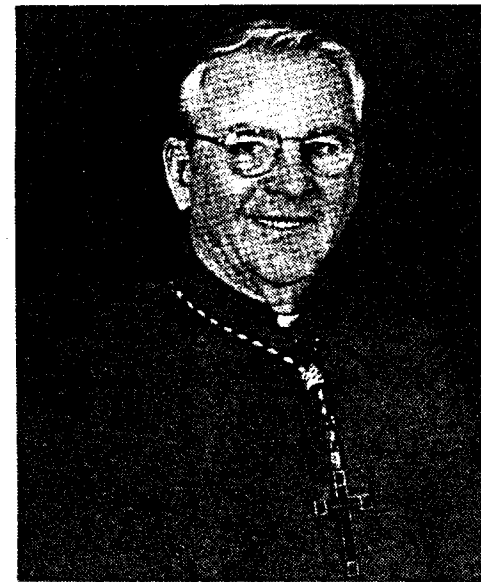

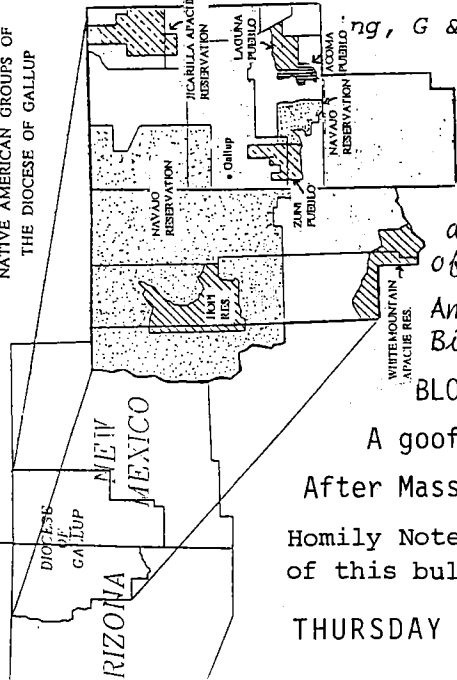
