**Facing Injustice...** As the birthday of **Martin Luther King Jr.**, approaches, many cities and churches will recall the courage and challenge of the civil rights leader who suffered and died for his beliefs.

When he confronted those who dealt out injustice, he and his followers were stopped, jailed, sometimes beaten, ridiculed and threatened. They were called rabble-rousers, Communists, disturbers of the peace and worse. Many people stood by and did nothing.

It is no wonder that Dr. King said, "In the end, we will remember not the words of our enemies, but the silence of our friends."

Whatever else we remember about Dr. King, we should recall that he chose not to remain silent in the face of injustice. Can we say that about ourselves? When anyone is treated without respect, without fair play, without kindness or Christian love, we must not remain mute. We should follow the suggestion of Dr. King: "With our faith, we will transform the jangling discords of our nation into a beautiful symphony of brotherhood."

### MEMORIAL DAY

May 30, 2005

Memorial Day emerged from the grim m shadows of the American Civil War. Before the close of the war, women began decorating the graves of soldiers who had died in that war. The practice quickly spread and a few years later May 30, 1868, was designated as Decoration Day — a day for placing flowers on the graves of Union and Confederate soldiers throughout the United States.

Over the years, it has become a day when all loved ones who have died — in war and otherwise — are remembered. In 1971, the United States Congress declared Memorial Day a national holiday to be observed annually on the last Monday in May.

The three Drumondi variegated maples, the two tri-colored beech, and in the Lincoln Street yard the weeping beech, Canadian cherry, and weeping gingko all deserve a closer look. Watch for the large pods soon to develop on the Kentucky Coffee tree planted last fall in the Old Church vard.

I am happy to say that in a few weeks, thanks to the arbor skills of Dan Buttler, we will be planting a number of trees not presently growing in our yards. They are all little critters so you will be able to watch them grow to maturity.



Today, it so often seems that authority, power is badly used and even less understood. Still Christ speaks strongly of it promising to be with His Church to the end of time. Today we pray for His Church!

Our Parish was established as a mission in 1851 to serve the Irish families of the just completed Cleveland-Columbus-Cincinnati RR running through Wellington.

In 1856 lot #7 on Hamilton St. was purchased where the 32 'x 20' frame Church was built two years later at a cost of \$600. A rectory was added in 1885.

The growing congregation found a new home just one block North when the unused North Elementary School was purchased at a public auction for \$700. The remodeled building held 70 persons and was dedicated December 6, 1908.

Again, increased membership called for more room. The Church was enlarged to seat 170 persons and dedicated in September of 1946. An adjoining rectory was built in 1948.

Ground breaking for this, our third church building, was on September 19, 1976. The late Cardinal James Hickey, then Bishop of Cleveland, came to dedicate it on this very date, October 23, 1977. Seating just over 400 persons, it cost \$674,000. The Tower and Elevator were added in 1985.

Homily Notes: Christ a King? Yes, and a different type of one, he reigns among us rather than over us. He expects the same of us, serving him by feeding, clothing, visiting, ministering to all who need even when we do not realize we are doing so in his name. After all, he is a different king of a king, one whose crown is made of thorns.

Dorothy Kazel, daughter of the late Malvina and Joseph Kazel, entered the Ursuline Nuns of Cleveland in 1960. A graduate of Ursuline College and John Carroll University, Sister Dorothy served the community in various roles.

In July of 1974 Dorothy's dream of serving on the diocesan mission team in El Salvador was realized, as she and Sister Martha Owen were assigned to serve in Chirilagua.

The life of Sister Dorothy did not end on a road in El Salvador. Her life, though changed, continues; her spirit lives on — in the people and missionaries of El Salvador, in her family and friends, in her Ursuline community, in all those persons whose very lives are "Alleluias."

(A quote from the last letter Sr. Dorothy wrote to her community. It was received after her death.) "We would like to once again THANK YOU (as we are still in the Thanksgiving season) for your continued support of us

here in El Salvador and we ask you to please continue praying for us and the people here. They are the Lord's 'little people' struggling to survive - - to make it alive through another day - - and needing His daily loving help to do it."
