HOMILY NOTES: This weekend, we celebrate the feast day of Christ's *EPIPHANY*, more commonly known to us as the Coming of the Three Wise Men. These three persons from nations not known to us are a liturgical way of exemplifying a profound mystery—that Christ was born as one of us, Emmanuel, to be the Savior, Jesus, of all mankind. Hence, all nations, all people are invited to sing His praises, our gifts like those of the magi; gold, frankincense and myrrh.

Certainly, these "wise men" when they returned to their own locals lost no time in being heralds of all they had seen and heard. When St. Francis of Assisi would talk to his community or give a talk to the crowds that followed him, he repeatedly urged them "to preach the Gospels, the Good News, often, and some times, do so using words." What does this mean for us? Simply put, actions speak louder than words. A good subject of reflection for these last few days of the Christmas Season—are people drawn to Christ and His Church by my presence, or is it the opposite?

THE CHRISTMAS SEASON: It continues through this Feast of the Epiphany until next Sunday's Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Then begins *ORDINARY TIME*. Ordinary Time lasts from Monday, January 14th to Ash Wednesday, February 5th. Lent is very early this year—the earliest it ever gets. In fact, the next time it will be this early is 2087. Don't think many of us will be around to experience it.

WHAT AWAITS US? We're at the starting gate of a new year. What will it hold for us? Only God knows. Yet if God knows, why not try to discover His plan for us each day?

We should carry on a daily dialog with God. Following His lead is always interesting and challenging. And much of the time it's filled with wonder and joy.

I remember the story of a small boy who prayed to God at the end of a fun, interesting Monday: "It's been a wonderful day, God. What do you have in mind for Tuesday?"

What does God have in mind for you in 2008? Keep in touch with Him, and you'll enjoy the trip around the sun.



Homily Notes: A good question—Why did Jesus ask John to baptize Him? Obviously there was no sin, original or personal, present in Him. So we are free to postulate a number of valid reasons. Here are a few that come to my mind. This one I feel is the most important—it presented God the Father with an apt occasion to proclaim Jesus' divinity—"This is My Beloved Son in whom I am well pleased."—another Epiphany. By His baptism, the very waters of the Jordan River were made holy, thus, it became a holy site, and to this day it is a place where people present themselves to be baptized.

A final reason relevant for us today; it is a powerful example for every one of us. Why I also need to become a beloved child of God through the waters of baptism. My baptism was my entrance into His Church, a member of the Body of Christ.

Our four Parish CLUSTERING report: At last Wednesday's meeting, again after a delicious meal of Chicken Paprikash, we debated how we would locate and utilize three priests in these four parishes. The model favored by a majority places two priests in Amherst to care for St. Joseph's and Nativity, and one priest at St. Patrick to care for this and Sacred Heart in Oberlin. Some Mass times would need to be changed and Saturday Mass could be alternated in location. None of us, especially our group and Oberlin's group were pleased with this suggestion. So the matter was referred to Bp. Lennon for some clarification before we meet next month here at St. Patrick's. Nothing has been decided in this regard. It is still wide open. So, please, pray for these clustering persons that we respond to the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

The Ecumenical Ash Wednesday Service will be held at St. Patrick Church this Wednesday, February 6th at 7:30 p.m. As always, several area Churches will be participating in this Worship Service. What a wonderful way to begin your Lenten journey!

As Jesus fasted 40 days in the desert, the Church traditionally fasts during Lent. A form of bodily prayer, fasting and abstinence in union with other Christians reminds us of our utter dependence on and love for God. A gesture of repentance, fasting is symbolic of a change of heart as we turn away from sin and live in fidelity to the Gospel.

Fasting: Ages 18-59 fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, limiting themselves to one full meal and two smaller meals each day, with no snacking between meals.

Saying "I love you" out loud is an important milestone in any relationship - whether you are

- revealing it to a rival sibling.

Saying "I love you" once is never enough. It is just the beginning. We must say "I love you" over and over again — we must hear "I love you" over and over again — before we begin to trust the reality of those words and before we can feel the weight of the love that lies behind them.

Jewish people are known as our "elder brothers and sisters." The late Archbishop of Paris, Cardinal Jean-Marie Aaron Lustier, who was Jewish born and later baptized Christian said "Christianity is the fruit of Judaism." For Christians to be anti-Semitic – hostile towards the Jews – was , he said, to hate themselves.



CLUSTER REPORT: After better than a year of monthly meetings, our Four Parish Cluster has received from Bishop Lennon a favorable response to the proposal sent to him last month. The following is a brief summary of that proposal. Fr. Reymann will speak about it at all Masses this weekend.

The Cluster Committee presented a process review to St. Patrick parishioners on Monday, April 21st in the chapel. Following a short presentation, the group asked questions and offered suggestions. The four parishes in the cluster (St. Joseph, Nativity, Sacred Heart and St. Patrick) have been challenged to function with three priests rather than the five that are now serving the four parishes. While finding it difficult, a plan has been worked out to meet the bishop's directive. However, the bishop has allowed us to continue with the remaining four priests until Father Reymann chooses to retire. So until that time, there will be few changes for us. We will be collaborating/consolidating with Sacred Heart on some parish programs and activities. Also, there will be work toward evangelization and continuing to try to improve Mass attendance. These are areas that the bishop has emphasized.



HOMILY NOTES: The scriptures today again use the context of a meal to teach a couple basic concepts about love and knowledge. We hear the Lord saying "it is love I desire, not sacrifice; knowledge rather than holocausts. Love that is loyal and steadfast, that can be counted on. Knowledge which is a total and personal experience of the one known. It involves an attachment of the will, the affections, the whole person. To know God in this way is the single hearted devotion of a Christian. As Abraham showed, the object of our faith is not just a truth to be believed, it is a Person on whom we are dependent.





Homily Notes: Daily, we are surrounded with signs and symbols; some are natural such as smoke— a sign of fire, others are acquired like the red octagonal signs we see along the side streets universally mean stop.

The cross in Roman days signified the means of executing the worst of criminals. Since the death of Jesus, it has become the sign of ultimate giving, total love, and human redemption. Christians wear the cross proudly. Thus, we celebrate today the *Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross*, sometimes called the *Triumph of the Cross*.



HOMILY NOTES: Today the visual effects of the wreath and the altar cloths speak of a new liturgical season embracing us. The color is similar to that of Lent, but the thrust much different. Advent is a period of "devout and joyful expectation" of remembrance of Christ's first coming, while awaiting His second coming at the end of time. This quality of joyful expectation distinguishes Advent from the penitential character of Lent.
