HOMILY NOTES: It may surprise many to find out that this **Feast of the Epiphany** is older than Christmas and is still celebrated in many countries more solemnly than the Birth of Christ, and more importantly, is of greater signification than the feast we hold in greater reverence. Why is Epiphany liturgically and faith wise of such importance?

The word epiphany is taken from a Greek word meaning a manifestation or disclosure. So the three Magi who adored the Christ child and presented their gifts are given to us as models, even mentors for us and all people to follow in our own lives.

They sought out the Christ following His star, they accepted Him as He is, they returned to their homes to proclaim the gift they had experienced.

Our task is to absorb the lessons of this great feast!

With next week's Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, the Christmas Season draws to a close and to give the Christmas Season its proper signification as the Christ becoming one of us, born of the Virgin Mary, we leave the outdoor crib, wreaths, and altar decoration intact for this full season. Let's savor as long as we can, this remarkable season.

It's an easy way to get updated on the latest stuff, rub shoulders with a couple hundred church folks, eat great food and get some exercise—I'll have a pool-side room. HOMILY NOTES: With today's feast of the Baptism of the Lord, the Church concludes the Christmas Season. It's an apt way to do so. The Child whose birth we rejoiced in only a few weeks ago, is now an adult, about to commence His earthly mission. After John's protest the he is not worthy to minister to Jesus through the ritual o baptism, he submits to Jesus' desire. Then we hear God the Father affirming the action with the words "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased. Listen to Him."

At our own baptism, God said to us through the priest "you are now truly a child of God." And we add the words "listen to Him, follow Him."

Today, through the simple rite of sprinkling with holy water, we renew our own baptismal commitment. May we daily to listen to and follow the Lord.



This Sunday afternoon at 2:30 p.m., the American Legion Post will observe the 66th anniversary of the Troop Transport "Dorchester" being torpedoed in the North Atlantic on February 3, 1943. Four U.S. Army Chaptains, after giving their own life jackets to needy soldiers, went down with the ship. The last anyone saw of them, they were standing on the slanting deck, their arms linked in prayer to the one God they all served. The Wellington Legion Post is dedicated to the memory of these "Four Chaplains." This afternoon is a busy one, should you have time, all are welcome to this ceremony.

PARISH ENDOWMENT FUND: The Parish Financial Council met last Wednesday at noon to review the current financial picture. It was decided that due to the severe drop in the net value of our holdings giving us a negative income for the year, we are not able to make any grants to charities or to scholarships. Grants are always made out of income so that the basic fund is protected. This is only the second time we have had such a situation, hopefully, it will not be with us much longer.

Wellington Area School Levy: This Tuesday, the school board will seek for a second time, the passage of the proposed new school levy. I have given this levy an awful lot of thought, prayer, and sought imput from knowlegable persons. And even though I might agree that in a rather restricted view of my position as Pastor of St. Pat's, I should not comment on this matter, I have always tried to seek the welfare of the whole community.

To my mind, the long-range development of adequate school facilities is a major priority. We can always argue the details of any proposal, but I am firmly convinced that the option chosen is the best one in the long run for our students, present and future, and for us who will be paying additional taxes for many years. A negative result Tuesday could easily result in higher taxes with less desirable facilities. What is best for the future of our schools?

HOMILY NOTES: In today's scripture, both St. Paul and the Lord speak about their necessity of preaching the Gospel, of spreading the Good News. Jesus said that it was "for this purpose I have come." You and I as followers of the Lord must likewise continue this mission—by our lives always preaching the Gospel of the Good News, and sometimes, as St. Francis said, doing so with the spoken word.

I conclude these notes with a reference to the letter composed by Sister Rita Mary Harwood for the P.S.R. Staff dinner/meeting (you'll hear it in the homily) in which Sister urges us gently to continue the good work we are doing for the Church.

Let's enjoy this Sunday evening at the "FAMILY NIGHT." It is all free. Will I see you there? Games for all ages. Lots of picnic style food.





The Season of LENT



The season of Lent is meant to refocus our vision on the sacrificial life, death, and glorious resurrection of Jesus. It is meant to clarify our vision of what is truly important in our lives, that is, our conversion to Christ through the community of the church.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

Abstinence: Catholics age 14 and older abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent.

A note from Bishop Lennon: In a recent survey conducted at Georgetown University, it was discovered that twenty-three percent of adult Catholics have gone through a divorce. Of the Catholics who have been divorced, only fifteen percent have sought resolution to their situation by petitioning for a declaration of invalidity of marriage.

I bring these statistics to your attention so that we may begin to consider ways in which we as a local Church can reach out to those who have been through a divorce and have questions regarding their relationship to the worshipping community. Many individuals are uncertain of their role in the life of the Church after a divorce. Many likewise have mistaken notions such as they are excommunicated or are not free to receive Communion even though they have not remarried.

Copies of a pamphlet which is geared toward those individuals who may be uncertain of their status in the Church as divorced individuals and who may be ready to explore a deeper involvement in the life of the Church are available at the bulletin stands.

The Tribunal of the Diocese of Cleveland will be presenting a new program for beginning the annulment process. The *Quick Start Program* is meant to provide individuals with a simplified method for the initial presentation of a case to the Tribunal.

The program will consist of two sessions. The first meeting will be a general overview of marriage as understood by the Catholic Church and an explanation of the Tribunal process. HOMILY NOTES: In today's Gospel selection, we hear the Lord Jesus saying "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified." And then, a few verses later, "unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat, but if it dies, it produces much fruit."

The message for us is clear. If we are to allow ourselves to be drawn to the Lord, to be glorified with Him, we must likewise accept our share of suffering and ultimately the dying at the end of this life. Like the wheat grain, through death we attain eternal life, glorified with the Lord Jesus.

Today in the Sacrament of Anointing, we seek the Lord's healing of our bodily and spiritual infirmities. And Wednesday and Thursday in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we seek God's forgiveness for the times we have failed in living as His sons and daughters. These days are great preparation for the events of Holy Week.





HOMILY NOTES: A theme we might take from today's scripture readings is the unity of biblical history and the unity of God's revelation in that history. We should not be surprised at such unity when we recall that God inspired the authors of the many biblical books in such a manner that they retained their own individuality while placing in words what the divine author wanted written. Because of this, we hold THE WORD sacred, and it's message timeless.

An example of this is from the first reading when Peter mentions "the God of Abraham, of Isaac, and of Jacob" brought him, Peter, to this very day, the healing of a cripple.

Western culture likes to look at our day as a mass of fragmented, disoriented, valueless individuals. We must reverse that attitude by becoming believers again, believers in our roots, in our story as Christians.

We thank them for participating in the two session instruction classes and for their willingness to assist in the distribution of Holy Communion.
