I hope that each of us have grown spiritually through this Christmas Season. The weekly scripture readings have been specially well chosen giving us much to reflect and meditate on. My thanks to all, specially the little kids, who have made our liturgies so meaningful.

Bishop Pevec called last Tuesday to let us know that he had just received word of *Bishop Donald Pelotte*'s death from an apparent stroke. You may recall that several years ago Bishop Don had to resign as Bishop of Gallup, New Mexico due to a serious illness. His funeral Mass in Gallup was Thursday. A memorial service will be held in Cleveland sometime in February.

Bishop Pelotte was ordained in Gallup as the youngest bishop in the U.S. He was a priest for just fourteen years--the first native born Indian to become a bishop. I was blessed to have known him in Cleveland while he was doing his doctoral work on the Vatican II documents. A marvelously gifted man, he was much loved by the people he served. Many of you will recall his several visits to St. Pat's when he came to thank us for so generously helping his diocese. Now may he enjoy the reward of his labors with the Lord he served so well.

Legend has it that our patron saint used the shamrock with its one leaf and three distinct segments as a neat aid when teaching the native folks of Ireland about the mystery of the **TRINITY**. The Chapel's faceted glass windows going clockwise depict the **HAND** of God the Father, the **HOST** and **CHALICE** for God the Son, a descending **DOVE** for, of course, the Holy Spirit, and the fourth window is the beautiful **SHAMROCK** of St. Patrick. So it is that when explaining the chapel features to visitors I usually call it **THE TRINITY CHAPEL**.

Over the years, it has become a day when all loved ones who have died – in war and otherwise – are remembered. In 1971, the United States Congress declared Memorial Day a national holiday to be observed annually on the last Monday in May.

On this Memorial Day, remember those who gave their lives for our country. But also pray for those who continue to keep America free, especially those in harm's way.

### Oktoberfest Dinner

Sunday, October 23, 1977 was a beautiful day in Wellington. The Easter lillies planted in the bed opposite the South Church entrance--after blooming for the Easter Season--were again in full bloom for this Sunday. During the next six months we will be working toward a year-round solution that we might continue to provide for the homeless on a more permanent basis.

We who have homes can only imagine what it must be like to be homeless. A homeless person has to deal, not only with the fact that he or she is homeless, but also with the illnesses and afflictions that plague all of society. Once again we will be housing women, children and men at the St. Joseph Church site for this winter season. We plan to open the doors on All Souls Day - Tuesday, November 2nd.

Your assistance in the past has been a tremendous blessing. Thank you for the much needed support you have given to the shelter. On behalf of the men, women and children whom you have cared for, I thank you. May our good Lord grant you many blessings.

A Note from Fr. Reymann: This weekend the Church throughout the world celebrates today's *Feast of the Holy Family*. It is a good reminder that like the Vatican Council said, Jesus wants every one of us to grow into the same holiness His family possessed so beautifully. Could we make this one of our New Year resolutions?
