Lenten Regulations

Fasting: Ages 18-59 fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, limiting themselves to one full meal and two smaller meals each day, with no snacking between meals. Abstinence: Catholics age 14 and older abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent.

By now everyone should know that LENT begins on Wednesday. Ashes will be distributed at the 9:00 a.m. Mass, during the day for the P.S.R. kids, and at the Community Service in the evening -- begins at 7:30 p.m.

What are YOU doing this Lent? As you see from the Lenten Regulations, the Church requires very little of us. What we can do is pretty well left up to each one of us. The Stations of the Cross each Friday with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament and a few words on Mary as the first disciple of the Lord begins at 7:30 p.m. (and hopefully over in less than an hour). Our P.S.R. kids have as their Lenten theme "Open Wide the Door to Christ." This could also be a good one for each of us -- the Lenten scripture selections are powerful ones, let the Spirit speak to us!

NOTES FROM FR. REYMANN: Last Friday we received a letter from Deacon Lou Maldonado, Program Director of the St. Joseph Overnight Shelter in Lorain. The shelter is presently at capacity with 50 men, 9 women and 4 children. He mentioned how pleased they all are with the wholesome, delicious meals our folks serve them twice monthly. He also hopes to be able to keep the shelter open in the summer months since the need is ongoing. Kindly keep Deacon Lou and his staff in your prayers.



Notes from Fr. Reymann: Over the past year, through the kindness of Father Anthony Sejba, Pastor of St. Francis Parish in Medina, and his associates Fathers Robert Lorkowski and Zachary Kawalec have been celebrating a Sunday Mass for us. This have been good for St. Pat's as it allows you to experience the different style of celebrating. And we all gain from this. Parking Lot Project: For the past several months our Financial Council has been reviewing the need of replacing the many deteriorating areas of our main parking lots. Rather than a limited approach as we have been doing over the past years, it was agreed to do the work all at one time. Bids were taken, the diocese has given its approval, and the contract was awarded to Denes Concrete. Work will begin Monday, May 23rd with the section off Lincoln Street. With favorable working conditions within that week, work will begin on the main lot and the area behind the Old Church, which then will be closed to traffic. For the weekend of May 28th/29th the three newer parking areas -- off Lincoln St. and the two off Adams St. should provide ample parking space. Just a bit longer walk to church.

The whole project should be finished within two weeks, meaning just one weekend of restricted parking.

I am very pleased with the "new" look of this historic old building; hope you think likewise. You might take a moment to walk around that area.



Homily Notes: Today's Feast of the Body & Blood of Christ, Corpus Christi, brings to mind another mystery. Just as profound as that of last week, the Holy Trinity, God existing as one while being known as three distinct persons.

Often in the Gospel stories we hear the Lord speaking in figures of speech, literally using stories about thing or events in our world to convey profound religious truths. Not so when he speaks about the Eucharist, His coming to us as bread and wine. Repeatedly and emphatically he insists that unless "you eat my flesh and drink my blood, you will not have life in you." Not even when his audience began walking away thinking this is a hard saying, did He change His words. So, too, the Church insists on Christ's real presence in the Eucharistic Communion we celebrate at every Mass. Christ is take into our bodies, we communicants become the body of Christ. Another beautiful reason to show why we should love one another!

Homily Notes: Again today in the first and third scripture readings the Holy Spirit talks to us about the Lord's Vineyard. He plants it fully expecting a plentiful harvest. When such does not happen, other uses are found for that land. In the liturgical feast for the week beginning last Thursday we are given a selection of saints who provided the Lord with a plentiful harvest. On the 29th we had the feast of the Archangels, Michael, Gabriel and Raphael - all most special messengers of God. Then on Friday we honored St. Jerome, the biblical scholar who gave us the New Testament translated from its original Greek into the language of common folks which was Latin, hence it is called the Vulgate edition. Saturday was the Little Flower's day, St. Theresa, and today we would honor our own Guardian Angels. Tuesday the much loved saint from Assisi, St Francis is remembered. Then on Friday we honor Mary in her title as Queen of the Holy Rosary, to which all of October is dedicated.



Next weekend we are celebrating: 160 years since our founding as a parish

34 years since Bishop Hickey dedicated this church

The Cleveland Diocese was founded in 1847 when Bishop Amadeus Rappe became the first bishop of the northern half of Ohio. With our founding year of 1851, we are among the oldest parishes in the diocese.

Bishop James Hickey became our bishop in June of 1974. Two years later he approved the construction of our new church, the first one he built in the diocese. When it was dedicated on the 23rd of October in 1977, he expressed his strong approval of its unique design, especially of the copper coated sanctuary screen and the adjoining chapel.

To date just 77 folks have made reservations for next Sunday's dinner. Our folks are just like my Dad --getting him out of the house for any special event took heroic effort on the part of my Mom; he loved his home and yard, but always enjoyed a good party. This parish should have a sell-out crowd for an event like this - but we don't. So please, make your old pastor a happy one by getting your reservation in today or a least before this coming Wednesday. You won't find a dinner like we're serving for just twelve bucks anywhere.

Homily Notes: Today's Gospel selection confronts an issue spoken of often today, what is the Church's domain and what is that of the state? Absolutely we know that this is all God's world, it all belongs to Him. Still we relegate some issues, practically speaking, to each. When I was teaching science, I frequently reminded my students that a truth in one field could not be contradicted by a truth in another. Years ago the Church leaders made that mistake in criticizing Galileo when he insisted that our solar system was sun-centered, not earth-centered. So today we continue our struggle deciding what belongs to Caesar and what belongs to God.

At all Masses again this weekend we will be taking an attendance count following the collection.

Next Sunday, October 23rd, is **World Mission Sunday**. United with the Catholics of the world at the Table of the Lord, we recommit ourselves to our vocation, through Baptism, to be missionaries. Our prayers and Eucharistic celebration next Sunday are directed in a special way toward our brothers and sisters throughout the world who are waiting to hear the joyous "Good News" of Jesus. Through our financial gifts, offered in next week's collection for the Society of the Propagation of the Faith, we become partners with missionaries who proclaim the Gospel and offer help and hope to the poor in mission countries.

On October 23rd the WYD11 Madrid Pilgrims will be sharing photos and items from their trip. The display will be set up in the hall to be viewed prior to and after the Oktoberfest Dinner.

In preparation for the **new translation of the Mass** that we will begin using on November 27th, Sacred Heart Church in Oberlin will be offering a 4-part series explaining the background of these changes as well as a step by step walk-through of the Mass with an explanation of the meaning and significance of the new wording. Everyone is welcome to these four sessions which will be held at Sacred Heart on Monday evenings, October 24th, November 7th, 14th and 21st. They will begin at 7 p.m. and end by 8:30 p.m. at the latest.




