THE MAGI or WISE MEN

In ancient Iran -- also known at Persia -- a priest was called a "magus." The plural is "magi." The word "magic" comes from the same root. Magi were experts in astronomy. This was useful in determining the calendar and the end of winter and the spring planting season. They

believed that stars and other celestial objects actually influenced, rather than coincided with, earthly events. One, or possible a series of omens, led them to believe that a royal prince had been born in Israel. They were sent as ambassadors to provide tribute to the newborn. The bible does not say how many Magi visited. It is assumed that there were three because of the number of gifts.



Lenten Regulations

Fasting: Ages 18-59 fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, limiting themselves to one full meal and two smaller meals each day, with no snacking between meals.

Abstinence: Catholics age 14 and older abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent.

Stations of the Cross, followed with Benediction and a short homily, will be on the Fridays of Lent at 7:30 p.m. - except for Good Friday. Plan to attend with your family.

Following an unexpected illness, GEORGIA ANTON, 90, died peacefully Thursday evening at the Hospice of St. Joseph in Lorain. Well known in the community, Georgia served many years as director of nursing at the Elms. Following her retirement she could be found almost daily at the Senior Citizens Wellington office, handling phone reservations. She, along with her late husband Bill, also organized the St. Pat's twice yearly cookie trays for all area shut-ins.





Notes from Fr. Reymann: A theme that you will hear repeated throughout this post-Easter season is Jesus seeking to convince individuals -- be they apostles, disciples, or just devoted followers -- that he is the same Jesus who suffered the terrible crucifixion, and is now truly risen, living among them. HOMILY NOTES: After many weeks of very long Gospel selections, today's reading is surprisingly short, just four verses. Thus the content is most important. St. John's community was now a divided one. Those who insisted, quite correctly, that Jesus was truly divine had been expelled from their synagogue. They were now a community in search of a stable foundation. That's why St. John stresses their relation with the Good Shepherd, "My sheep hear my voice, I know them, and they follow me."

That's why it is likewise a fitting reminder for all of us that the One you and I are following is truly divine and truly human. One Person, with two distinct natures -- human and divine. A point well emphasized throughout this Easter Season.

HOMILY NOTES: "Now, indeed I know that you are a man of God." Words of the widow to Elijah after he had asked the Lord to return "the breath of life" to her dead son. 

The Old Testament folks look to David as their greatest king. That may be so, but, there is one undisputed exception. His roving eye caused him to become one awful father figure. He committed adultery, then caused the death of his lover's husband.

When the prophet Nathan diplomatically pointed out his sinfulness, David sought God's forgiveness. To love is to be forgiven! And King David loved God. A powerfully beautiful lesson for all of us. No sinner is ever refused forgiveness should they simply seek the Lord. To love is to be forgiven!



A dollar bill's message

Look at the back of a dollar bill. On the left circle, which is one side of the Great Seal, are the Latin words Annuit Coeptis, which mean "He [God] favors our undertakings."

The pyramid in the left circle represents material strength and endurance. Yet the open spot near the top of the pyramid means there's more good work to be done in our country. The "eye" atop the pyramid represents the "eye of God," watching and reminding us that spiritual matters are more important than material concerns. Under the pyramid, Novus Ordo Seclorum refers to a "new order of the ages."

On the right circle is an eagle, our country's national emblem, symbolizing strength and victory. The shield on the eagle's breast signifies self-reliance. One of the eagle's claws holds an olive branch, representing peace. The other talon holds arrows, referring to power and protection.

The center of the bill says "In God We Trust."

Homily Notes: Doesn't it seem like haggling for a better deal is just a part of all of us. Whether it's to buy a new car or an item at the village yard sale, we are always looking for a better price, a more suitable deal. I became rather adept at this when shopping in the Old City on my visit to Jerusalem.

So we shouldn't be surprised when Abraham skillfully maneuvered the Lord to lower the number of good folks he would find in the wicked cities of Sodom and Gomorrah. He probably could have reduced the number to just a single good soul. So wonderfully merciful is our God.

This theme continues in the Gospel selection with St. Luke's urging us to "ask and you will receive, seek and you will find, knock and the door will be opened." The goodness of our heavenly Father exceeds all we have ever known.





NOTES FROM FR. REYMANN: Another one of our retired senior Priests died Wednesday. Fr. Patrick Shields, 75, last assignment was at Holy Family Parish in Stow where his funeral Mass will be celebrated Monday.

Word was just received Friday morning that my classmate and dear friend to so many of us, Bishop A. James Quinn apparently died in his sleep Thursday evening. At our class get-together just a few weeks ago he seemed in great spirit and excellent health. Apparently God wanted to relax listening to the Irish tunes Bp. Jim loved to sing. Our loss is heaven's gain!

Thirty-six years ago at 11:00 a.m. on October 23, 1977, Bishop James A. Hickey dedicated this our newly constructed third church building. The first church was located just a block south on Hamilton Street. It is now a private home easily recognized by the horizontal second story windows.

When the North Primary School was left unused due to the newly built centralized school in town, it was purchased at auction in 1904 to become our second location. In 1945 Fr. Charles McCann added a basement and enlarged the first floor to its present size. He also built the nearby block rectory.

Ground-breaking on this building took place September 19, 1976. Building continued through the terribly cold winter months. It became the first church blessed by Bp. Hickey before, in a few months, he was transferred to Washington, D.C.

Some Parish statistics: In the just concluded October attendance figure we averaged 513 persons for the two weekends. Last year the number was 474, down from 517 in 2011. We have 647 registered parishioners and send out 335 bimonthly envelope packets. While I am concerned about those who choose not to actively participate, I am most grateful for the many who are the life of our parish.

Next weekend at all Masses, we will have a brief talk on the subject of immigration by a parishioner from Sacred Heart Chapel in Lorain. Immigration does not affect many folks in our area but it is of great concern in our country and in many areas of the diocese. We look forward to learning more about this important issue.





This shrub, native to Mexico, is at the heart of legend about a poor girl who wanted to bring Baby Jesus a gift one Christmas Eve. As she walked to church, she gathered a bouquet of weeds — which Jesus miraculously transformed into lovely red flowers. Thus the poinsettia (named for Joel Poinsett, the U.S. ambassador to Mexico who first brought the plant to America) is known in Mexico as la flor de la Nochebuena (flower of the Holy Night). The poinsettia is also an ideal Christmas symbol because its leaves turn red when deprived of sunlight and its flowers (the red inner buds) bloom in December.

FATHER'S NOTES: Again on this third Sunday of Advent the liturgy presents us with a powerful set of scripture readings. From my many years of being a people watcher I think I can safely conclude that most of us Americans are impatient people, we always need to be doing something or being consumed with our electronic toys. So St. James is talking to us in his second reading -- "Be PATIENT, brothers and sisters, until the coming of the Lord." Just sitting still, letting the WORD soak in, becoming a part of us, is an easy and necessary way of spiritual growth.

The liturgy, for this very reason, encourages us to have a brief moment of silence after each of the scripture readings. That also becomes a bit of a challenge for us. It forces us to listen more attentively to the readings (and for us who are proclaimers of the Word to do so more effectively.)

Maybe this could become a worthy habit for all of us. Listening more attentively, letting the Word of God become our word.
