# **Celebrating Epiphany**

Epiphany, from the Greek word *epiphaneia*, means an appearance or manifestation. Christians celebrate this festival each year on January 6, the 12th day after Christmas.

Epiphany marks the coming of the Magi, or wise men, to worship the baby Jesus. Because the Magi were Gentiles, Epiphany symbolizes the first recognition of Christ by non-Jews. It's a reminder that Christ came as the light — and Savior — of the whole world.

The traditional color for Epiphany is green, indicating life, growth, hope and eternity. Symbols for the season include a light, candle or star; a crown or three crowns; three gifts; and a globe. In the modern church, Epiphany has become a time to focus on reaching out and "showing" Jesus as the Savior of all people. It's also a reminder to engage in Christian community and to heal divisions among God's children.

**FATHER'S NOTES:** With today's feast of the Baptism of the Lord, the season of Christmas draws to a dramatic close. Jesus, now a thirty year old adult, meets his cousin John at the river Jordan. He tells John to baptise him! John objects, saying the opposite should take place. Happily for us and for all mankind, Jesus insists.

As Jesus came out of the river, the voice of God the Father exclaimed, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." The first biblical proclamation of Jesus as He is, the Son of God. And since it was necessary for Jesus to be baptised, so is it for the rest of mankind.

The Church gives us baptism and all the other sacraments as opportunities for us to encounter God. What we do to prepare for them is important, still, we must always take note that it is God's initiative and action that is all important. Not what we do, but what God does. Just as He spoke of Jesus at the Jordan, so He comes to us in Confirmation, Penance, and especially the Holy Eucharist. Let us remember this as we now enter Ordinary Time.

Fr. Reymann's reflections on today's scripture selections: Catholics and we can even say that all Christians today are enjoying a far greater exposure to biblical selections than at possibly any time in the history of the church. The Fathers at the Vatican council, now fifty years past. saw the urgency for this to happen. So in the very first document they wisely promoted our present liturgical system. The Sunday readings are in three cycles, A, B, and C. The daily readings in just two, one and two. This year we are reading cycle "A" on the Sundays and cycle "Two" for the weekdays.

As we experience these readings the careful follower may detect a certain repetition. Even so, it is hoped that this will promote a real love of God and a steady but constant growth in holiness shown in our concern for God's desire for peace and justice throughout the world.

So today as the scriptures once again reveal for us a bit more of the mystery of God we ask that we may also grow in our knowledge and love of Him.

No one wanted to be sent there.

Through the heroic efforts of these two tireless missionaries, order was restored among those forced to live there. Within a few short years all sorts of vegetables and fruit bearing trees were being raised. A few years later, Father Damian proudly mentioned in a homily that he too now shared their sickness from which he died. Sister continued her dedicated efforts for thirty-five years. Both are today canonized Saints. Sister's feast day was this past Thursday.

You and I may not be called to such heroic action as these two saints. But called we are. "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of Men". God calls us all to live the Gospel where we are, "bloom where you are planted". What does God ask of me as I journey through Life?

**Father's notes:** The extreme cold of recent weeks tends to have a chilling effect on everyone, pulling us into our own warm comfortable space, distant from the terribly cold outside. Today's scripture selections orientate us in a completely opposite posture -- away from self into the real world.

"You are the "salt of the earth" and the "light of the world." God is calling us, urging us to give meaning (flavor) to our worldly journey while lighting the way. We know from the readings of recent weeks how we are called as were the apostles for this very task. And I suspect that many of us reply, as they did, that we are not prepared or equipped for the task.

St. Paul addresses this head on when he says in today's second reading "I came to you in weakness and fear and much trembling, and my message and my proclamation were not with persuasive words of wisdom, . . . so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God."

What we accomplish in our daily efforts is a sure sign of God working through our human limitations. Have faith. This is His world and we are His people!


### Prayer to St. Patrick, Missioner

**Father's Notes** on today's scripture selections: St. John's account of Jesus meeting the Samaritan woman at Jacob's well is most special to me. Years ago as part of my three month stay in Rome the thirty priests in our sabbatical group made a ten day tour of the Holy Land. At every sacred spot one of us read the Gospel account of what happened there. At Jacob's well it was my turn to do the reading.

The well was protected by an open shed with an adjoining small yard lined with stone benches. A terribly stern looking man sat next to the well keeping us all in his watch. I asked another priest to read the Samaritan woman's dialogue while I did the narration. It was a truly wonderful experience. On this we all agreed.

An added experience was my wanting to find the actual depth of the well. Having taught physics for a number of years, I recalled the formula I needed:  $d = \frac{1}{2}$  a x  $t^2$  distance is the product of one half the acceleration of gravity times the time squared. So I carefully dropped a small stone down the well while a buddy checked the time of the fall. We figured the depth at around seventy feet. The gentleman watching us probably couldn't wait to tell his family about the strange group visiting that day. I thoroughly enjoyed it, and relive the experience with every reading of this powerful Gospel.

**Father's Notes:** Today's feast of the Most Holy Trinity speaks to us of a multitude of things. Primarily it refers to God, to ourselves, to our community, and most especially of how all this is inter-related -- God, us and community.

For a moment, just reflect on the nature of God. Try to express your thoughts. Tell a non-believer about this God.

A story is told that St. Augustine who walking along the Mediterranean Sea shore contemplating the Trinity met a youngster taking buckets of water from this vast lake, dumping them into a little opening he made in the sand, and watched the water rapidly filter back into the sea. The lad asked him what he was thinking about. When told he was reflecting on the Trinity, the lad responded that his attempt to empty the sea into a little sand puddle was just as futile as Augustine's attempt to understand the Trinity.

God is certainly a mystery. Still, we humans are always seeking understanding of mysteries.

Moses speaks of God as "merciful and gracious, ...rich in kindness and fidelity."

Paul writes of him as "the God of love and peace."

And the apostle whom Jesus loved says in today's Gospel that "Jesus so loved the world (that includes us) that he gave his only Son." Love provides us with the best insight into the mystery of this "most Holy Trinity."

### **Three Interwoven Circles**

Each circle in this symbol represents one of the Persons of the Holy Trinity — the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The circles, having no beginning and no end, signify the Trinity's eternal nature. The circles' interlacing symbolizes unity. In the center is a triangle, an ancient symbol of the Trinity.



**Father's Notes:** Today's feast marks the anniversary of the dedication of the cathedral church of Rome on land owned by the Laterani family, by Pope Sylvester on the 9th of November in the year 324. It served as the episcopal seat of the Pope for nearly eleven centuries. The present structure dates to 1646. Beneath its high altar rest the remains of a small wooden table on which tradition has it that St. Peter celebrated Mass.

This basilica is considered "the mother and head of all churches of Rome and the world." For centuries all Romans were baptised there with fitting solemnity. The Lateran Basilica along with the Vatican, St. Mary Major and St. Paul's are called the four major churches of Rome.

This feast causes us to reflect on our own center of worship. Do we see it not only as the dwelling place of the Lord Jesus in the tabernacle but more importantly as the place where we gather seeing God present in his Word and his Sacrament.

Do we make an effort to be present a few minutes early, being ready to celebrate actively and fully in the beautiful community prayer ever Mass is? Let's make it our own basilica.

Friday we celebrated the funeral liturgy for JOSEPHINE PASADYN, 94. Jo and her husband Al raised their family on Main Street just a few doors from the Old Church. In their later years they frequently participated in the morning Mass. May they and all our beloved deceased be now enjoying the presence of the Risen Lord.

## The symbolism of the Advent wreath

The Advent wreath is a symbol of watchfulness and increasing joy as the birth of Jesus approaches. The circular form of the wreath symbolizes eternity or life without end. The candles remind us that Jesus is the Light of the World who brought light and life to a dark world (see John 1:4-5). We light a new candle on each of the four Sundays of Advent. As the light grows, so does our anticipation and joy.

Three of the four weekly candles are purple, the traditional color of royalty. The purple candles represent hope, peace and love, respectively. For the third Sunday, a pink candle is used to symbolize joy. After the Advent season, the wreath is replaced by a large white candle. White represents the purity of Jesus.

The poinsettia is also an ideal Christmas symbol because its leaves turn red when deprived of sunlight and its flowers (the red inner buds) bloom in December.
